On or about June ^{4th CM} 11, 1984, to October 9, 1984, at Dade County, Florida, KENNETH LAWRENCE BRYANT falsely assumed and pretended to be an officer and employee acting under the authority of the United States and a department and agency thereof, to wit: a Special Agent for the federal government, and did act as such, with intent to defraud *etc*

AFFIDAVIT

Being duly sworn, Carlos Costa deposes and says:

1. I am a Special Agent with the FBI assigned to Miami, Florida.

2. I received the following information in my official capacity:

(a) On or about June 11, 1984, at Dade County, Florida, Kenneth Lawrence Bryant, falsely told a state university police officer at Florida International University (FIU), in substance, that he (Bryant) was a Special Agent of the federal government working out of the FBI office in Miami. (As far as can be determined, Bryant has never been a Special Agent with any agency or department of the federal government; further Bryant has never worked at (or out of) the FBI office in Miami.)

(b) During a later portion of the above conversation, Bryant told the police officer that he (Bryant) was attempting to execute a federal warrant for obstruction of justice on an FIU student (by the name of Constance Weirick); Bryant asked the police officer to observe the comings and goings of Weirick in order to assist him (Bryant) in serving this warrant (for obstruction of justice); Bryant also gave the police officer an auto tag number. (The auto tag was registered to Weirick.)

(c) Later during the same conversation, Bryant gave the officer a second tag number and asked the officer to run the tag (that is, obtain the name of the registered owner); Bryant

claimed this second auto tag was part of the same investigation in which he (Bryant) was attempting to serve the warrant (for obstruction of justice) on Weirick. The officer ran this second tag by communicating over his (the officer's) car radio; the information requested was obtained from a law enforcement computer; when the information came back over the radio, Bryant was monitoring the same radio frequency and, thereby, obtained confidential information from a law enforcement computer.

(d) On or about June 4, 1984, approximately a week prior to the above incident, at Dade County, Bryant asked a detective with the City of Miami Police Department to deliver a letter to Investigator Earnest Neal with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. In this letter to Neal (a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A (2 pages)), Bryant identified himself as a "U.S. Special Agent" with the "Department of Justice."

(e) On September 17, 1984, Bryant -- apparently using a radio under his personal control -- transmitted over a City of Miami Police Department radio frequency and identified himself as "... Justice, Unit 321, signal 38965." Bryant then requested to speak with Detective Austin. (Bryant was not authorized to transmit over this channel, for among other reasons, he was not licensed by the F.C.C. to make radio transmissions.) (I have listened to the tape of Bryant's transmission and it sounds like the voice of Bryant, whom I have personally interviewed.)

(f) On October 9, 1984, Bryant transmitted over a confidential FBI (Miami) radio frequency. Bryant identified


himself as "KB" signal 38965 and stated there was an "intrusion" on the system. (While I did not personally hear this part of his transmission, I did hear a later part, and the voice appeared to be the same as the Kenneth Bryant I had previously met.)
